HOW TO COMPLETE THE ORAL LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT?

Overall Teacher Judgement (OTJ) Observational assessment supported by evidence.

- Observe the learner in a range of contexts (in class, in the playground, with whanau etc).
- Talk time to have deep conversations with the learner (authentic).

STEPS

- 1. Complete a draft version based on your existing knowledge of the learner.
- 2. Identify any areas that you are not sure about.
- 3. Go and seek observational evidence for the things you are unsure about.
- 4. Review the rubric again now you have a deeper knowledge of the learner's oral language behaviours.
- 5. Have a professional discussion with a colleague or work with your team to justify your decisions.
- 6. Where possible, provide evidence for your decisions.

TYPES OF EVIDENCE YOU COULD COLLECT

- Student voice videos or voice recordings
- Journal entries about things you have observed
- Whanau voice
- Peer assessment
